Meet Mark

One of my stand out memories was when I was setting up Latin Odyssey and wanting to offer something a little different. I remember being in a lonely corner of north-west Argentina, a small town called San Carlos, searching for some unique white water to raft. I stumbled across a remote rafting station. I met the owners who asked me to stay the night and after a few too many beers they decided to take me on a five day journey across some of the most remote rivers I have ever encountered. This ended with a three day rafting expedition down the Bermejo River which forms the border with Bolivia.

This secluded river, accessible only by entering Bolivia through an unknown border crossing was devoid of human life. It was an impenetrable jungle and the river was our guide. Nights were spent sleeping on the few sandy banks we found and the days were spent rafting or carrying the heavy raft over the most dangerous of rapids. All the while we felt like we were being watched by the unknown sounds of the wildlife that lived there. My rafting guide's hospitality and generosity was incredible. They took me into their homes, showed me a unique part of their world, never asking for anything in return and left me with an experience that will last a lifetime.

NEW Royal Tented Suite, Jawai Bandh, Bisalpur, Rajasthan, India

A stunning new Royal Tented Suite has been added to the collection at Jawai. This camp is set on a dam in Rajasthan that is renowned for its leopards and is a temporary home for migratory birds such as flamingos. The new suite has its own pool and sunbathing area and is double the size of the standard tents. It is tucked away in a more private area of the camp and offers a superlative level of comfort.

During the day enjoy leopard safaris, spot migratory birds on the lake and walk at dawn or dusk with traditional Rabari herdsman and their flocks - an experience not to be missed. This Relais & Chateaux resort stays true to its conservation goals without compromising on comfort. Just nine luxury tents have been sympathetically built into the landscape with spectacular views of the surrounding dramatic wilderness.



WEATHER CONDITIONS

April to June is summer with temperatures steadily rising from 32°C to 45°C. Monsoon rains fall between July and September with temperatures falling to around 30°C. A second hot season runs from October to November followed by winter from December to March. Temperatures are much lower during the winter period, making it a good time to travel for those who don't like the heat.

NEW Half-day game drive, Sher Bagh, Ranthambore Park



The introduction of a half-day game drive at Sher Bagh resort has been a massive success for guests. It allows a six-hour drive into Ranthambore Park with no restrictions on where you can go, allowing you to traverse an area of 430sqkm without being confined to one particular zone. Ranthambore is a beautiful park with a stunning natural wilderness where tiger numbers - and sightings - were at a ten-year high in 2016.

The spa at Sher Bagh has been enlarged and improved meaning that you can relax and be pampered when not on a game drive. The Royal Tented Suite here is well worth enjoying for a couple of nights to enjoy the best of safari luxury. This camp was one of the first to be established and it promotes sustainable tourism with the provision of exemplary service and superb experiences at its heart.

BEST TIME TO GO

For tigers..... February, March and April. Drier conditions mean that wildlife congregates around watering holes.

For birds..... October to December. After the monsoons the parks are lush and green: trees are blossoming and flowers blooming. Bird watching is second to none at this time.


