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

For your first trip to Africa or to dip your toe into the Safari pool, look no further than South Africa. Flying into Cape Town, the oldest city in the country and often referred to as The Mother City, you'll explore the multitude of trendy art galleries and eateries, and soak up the incredible natural beauty of the surrounding mountains and sea.

From Cape Town, you'll journey through the South African Wine lands, staying in Franschhoek, with plenty of time to sample the local produce. There are then self-drive options available to go whale watching on the coast or hike your way through the Drakensberg mountains.

Then it's safari time! Flying from Cape Town to Skukuza and staying in the Sabi Sand Private Game Reserve, part of the Greater Kruger area. Here you'll spend up to a week taking morning and evening game drives, or walking safaris throughout the day. Here you'll have an excellent chance of seeing The Big 5: Lion, Leopard, Elephant, Rhino, and Buffalo.

It's not just a viewing party either, with extremely exclusive access to the Sabi Sand Reserve, and limited group numbers, you'll have access to a huge bank of knowledge from your highly-trained guides, making for an all-encompassing educational experience, for you and your family.

- Get your adrenaline on with a dip in the Devils Pool, Victoria Falls.

Zambia's South Luangwa Valley is as suitable for the seasoned safari-goer as it is for a first-timer. The banks of the Luangwa River are teeming with wildlife and are a haven for the often elusive Leopard, though you'll also see a wild array of birdlife and predator action with Lion and Hyena.

Staying at Time+Tide Chinzombo, there is a strong chance of being awoken by a herd of Elephant crossing the river after sunrise, the joy of which is difficult to explain to those who have yet to experience it. You'll also have access to their the award-winning in-house guide team, who will orchestrate your safari ambitions, whether that be tracking Wild Dog or birding.

A Zambian sunrise is a special sight to behold, so you'll have to set off before dawn on a walking safari, where you'll be in the heart of the action as the bush comes to life.

After your safari, no visit to Zambia is complete without seeing Victoria Falls up close and personal. Take a helicopter tour to see it from a lesser-seen angle or we can organise a guide to take you to the famous Devil's Pool, for the perfect Instagram shot.

Start your itinerary by experiencing life by the lagoon, and a safari stay in one of Africa's best-kept secrets: the Khwai Private Reserve, on the edge of the Okavango Delta. Offering exceptional game viewing on foot, while driving or in a traditional dugout Mokoro canoe.

You'll stay in sophisticated and chic luxury tented camp, Sable Alley, the perfect spot for the vast array of wildlife on offer in the Okavango Delta, and with lodgings so close to the river you can view game without leaving your private balcony.

Once you've had your fill of riverside fun, you'll head into the dry heart of the Kalahari Desert. If you arrive in the dry season (March-October) you'll be able to take a quad bike tour of the vast salt flats of the Makgadikgadi Pan, where you will experience the stark isolation that only the desert can offer.

However, if you arrive during the rainy season (November onwards) you could see the largest Zebra and Wildebeest migration in Southern Africa, or take a heli-tour to see flamingoes in awe-inspiring numbers, from an incredibly unique vantage point.

One of the largest Game Reserves on the entire continent of Africa, this enormous safari area is the perfect hunting ground for Cheetah, Jackal, Hyena and the rare and endangered African Wild Dog.

Then you'll visit Ruaha National Park, a remote wilderness offering an authentic and profound safari experience. Ruaha is also home to 10% of the world's wild Lion population.

While in Ruaha you'll stay at Jabali Ridge in one of their 8 stunning suites. A night game drive here is an absolute must, where you will explore the secrets of the more elusive nocturnal inhabitants of the park.

After all that safari action it's time for some rest and relaxation, in Zanzibar! Situated on a glorious powder-sand beach, the vibrant, yet laid back resort of Matemwe Lodge is the perfect way to end your trip to Tanzania.

Your first day on safari will see you hiking to spot see the Big 5 safari animals: Lion, Leopard, Elephant, Rhino and Buffalo, followed by an afternoon boat trip, all set among a backdrop of the glowing red cliffs of the Waterberg Mountains.

A stay at Marataba is incomplete until you've had a night under the stars staying at the Thabametsi Treehouse. More than just a sleep-out this night spent under a blanket of stars is as far away as you can get from the hubbub of 21st-century living.

Then it's time to move onto Mozambique, a perfect way to relax after a few full-on days of safari. Here you can gaze upon the rich colonial past, take a horseback ride along the white sand beaches of Vilankulo, or scuba dive off the coast in search of Mozambique's famous megafauna.

Start in Beijing: with more than 3,000 years of history the city is packed full of wonderful sites. Here you'll visit of the best-preserved examples of Chinese culture and architecture: The Forbidden City, and also see the infamous Tiananmen Square.

From Beijing, you'll transfer to Xian, for two nights exploring the Old City. See the Tang Dynasty show, and visit the Terracotta Warriors. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is a collection of 8,000 terracotta sculptures depicting the army of the 3rd Century BC Emperor.

Then head to Chengdu the capital of Sichuan province, for a visit to the Panda Breeding Research Base, the world's premier research centre when it comes to the behaviour and breeding of pandas. A perfect chance for children and adults alike to learn about these most-rare of bears. There is also an option for a few days cruising the River Li, or drive to Degen the original inspiration for the mythical utopia of Shangri-La

Your final stop is on Shanghai, for 3 nights in the countries most populace city, marvelling the beautiful French colonial and Art Deco Architecture.

Travel on to Agra, to see first-hand one of the New Seven Wonders of the World: The Taj Mahal. Built in the 17th Century, the Taj Mahal is an astounding example of Indo-Islamic architecture, and absolutely breathtaking to behold.

Next, you will go on to Ranthambore National Park, one of the best places in the world to see tigers in their natural habitat. With over 1300km² of protected land, and a massive conservation effort, the tiger populations of Ranthambore have stabilised in the past decade.

It's then a 4-hour private transfer to the Pink City of Jaipur. You'll have a chance to visit the Amber Fort, before joining a local family for a traditional Rajasthani meal.

Anyone visiting Rajasthan must stay at the Raas Devi Ghar, set in the Aravali Hills, this hotel is an iconic vision of opulence and after being left to ruin many decades ago it has been beautifully remodelled inside, and refurbishing the exterior to its former splendour. Your journey will end in Mumbai with a walking tour of the city with a local guide, before returning home.

A Leopard Safari in Yala National Park is a must of any Sri Lankan itinerary. With a trusted guide you will embark on a game drive to see the elusive jungle cat in the wild, alongside elephants, crocodile, and jackal.

When it comes to R&R we recommend the Cape Weligama, a stunning terracotta clad refuge with stunning views overlooking the Indian Ocean come complete with private beach. Perfect for your last few days before returning home, where there is also an option for a Dubai stop off en route.


